

REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

We've Made Advances But There's Much To Be Done

This is the 13th year of the founding of Lake Detroiters, Inc., and while I am a more recent member of the organization I feel that while we have made certain advances as outlined in previous bulletins, there is still very much to be done.

The control and eradication of weeds in our two lakes appears to be a most serious problem and I can assure you that we would welcome any and all suggestions that would in any way help us to wipe out this menace.

As you know, we are using sodium arsenite to help control the weed menace and copper sulphate to combat the algae, but we are very disappointed with the results obtained.

We have found, however, that it does help some, and if any of our members want to get a supply of copper sulphate, it can be obtained from Boyer's Produce in Detroit Lakes. A permit must be obtained to spread copper sulphate, but this can be procured by contacting Dr. Tom Rogstad.

I would like to urge each and every person living on our lakes to become active members of our association, attend our meetings and bring with you any suggestions that you think would help to improve our association.

It has been suggested that some members of our organization take time out to contact

those persons living on the lakes and urge them to become dues-paying members of our association. I think each person eligible for membership should volunteer his membership, attend our meetings and be sure to air his or her views on what should be done to improve our lakes and properties.

You will find enclosed a statement of your dues and an application for insect control. In order to make the insect control a success it seems to me that each and every member should arrange to have his property sprayed and from my own experience I can say that I was not too impressed by the results two years ago, but last year we were very well pleased with the results obtained.

We would appreciate it very much if you would return the statement to us at your earliest convenience with your remittance covering your dues and also advise us as to whether or not you wish to unite with us in the insect control program.

Residents of Big and Little Detroit lakes, whether members or not, are invited to the meeting, according to President Nestor Maehren.


Lake problems will be discussed, committee reports given and officers and directors elected.

Report Says Lake Habitat Adequate For Fish Spawning

Detroit lake has adequate habitat for fish spawning, it was announced recently by William Joy, regional fisheries manager with headquarters at the Detroit Lakes state fish hatchery.

Joy said, "Because the lake has adequate habitat for fish spawning, it is seldom necessary to use hatchery-reared fish to maintain a maximum annual crop of game fish and panfish."

Northern and walleye fishing on the lake in 1960 was the best in recent years, according to surveys. The outlook is just as good for 1961, the hatchery manager states.

Detroit Lakes Plans Lake Shore Project

The city council and the city planning commission of Detroit Lakes are aware of the erosion problem that exists along the lake shore from Washington Avenue to the swimming beach at the American Legion Park.

The public is also aware of the condition that exists, as was shown in a survey conducted by the Junior Chamber of Commerce. Improvement to the lake shore was listed as one of the most important and needed projects for the city to undertake.

The city officials have ordered a soils survey of the lake bottom and the preparation of preliminary plans and estimates of cost for this work. The soils survey was completed this spring while the lake was still covered with ice. The Minnesota department of conservation has been contacted regarding the proposed project, and they could see no obstacles insofar as their department was concerned.

The tentative plan at this date is to construct a dike of sand and gravel along the lake shore during the winter months when the ice will support trucking. As soon as the ice is off the lake in the spring, bottom silt for a distance of 100 to 150 feet from shore would be removed by dredge or drag line and placed behind the gravel dike.

It is felt that wave action during the summer would then

wash the sand into the lake and form a sand beach. It is anticipated that the sand would stay in place at a slope of between 7 to 1 and 10 to 1 depending on the size of the particles. The final section proposes that the edge of a sodded berm start 33 feet from the center line of West Shore Drive. The berm would slope from its edge to the beach at a slope of 5 to 1 so that it could be sodded and maintained. A sand beach section between the sodded berm and the waters edge, lying at a slope of 10 to 1 and being approximately 25 feet in width would then provide space for lake shore activities.

We hope the project will prove to be a feasible one as it will add a great deal to the beauty of Detroit Lakes as well as to the facilities for our local people and summer tourists.

Both measures are aimed at curtailing the pollution and littering of Minnesota's lakes and streams.
